ABCD Expedited Certification For Pediatric Dentists Only

Pediatric dentists receive extensive formal educational training in early childhood oral health. Therefore the completion of the 3-hour ABCD continuing education course, *Oral Health for Infant and Toddlers* is not required for ABCD certification <u>but is always recommended</u>. General dentists must review the ABCD curriculum, attend a county-specific orientation, and complete billing training from DSHS/HRSA prior to being ABCD certified by the University of Washington.
